Art allows pupils to express their feelings and ideas, both as a means of self-expression and to communicate with others. Art helps pupils to begin to develop an understanding of how it reflects and shapes our society, contributing to a nation's culture, creativity and wealth.	Art is an important part of developing pupils' ability to express their individual creativity, working both individually and collaboratively with others.	Art engages, inspires and challenges pupils, equipping them with the knowledge and skills to experiment and invent.
